

How to partner with local, operational or regional response entities to better prepare for an emergency or disaster.

How does your community begin and/or sustain its partnership in preparing and responding to community/regional emergencies or disasters?

- Your community's lead for emergency preparedness/disaster response should be familiar with your local government emergency plan. The plan for your location may be under city, county or regional government agencies.
- If your community is located within an incorporated city, city government is required to have an emergency plan.
- If your community is located within an unincorporated area, the county government is required to have an emergency plan for your area.
- Whether your community provides skilled nursing, assisted living or is a PACE organization, state and/or federal standards require that your community plan be coordinated with your respective local government agency – or at least not conflict with the plan.
- Some standards require that you participate in local community-wide disaster drills or simulate your own.
- Reach out to your local emergency response agency to introduce your community, your residents and how you can become an active partner in planning for emergencies and responding to disasters.
- ***Many local emergency preparedness/disaster response plans contain invaluable information on how your community responds to a disaster, often provide helpful tools in forming your own plans, and disaster-related events in your local area.***
