Create an Atmosphere of Excitement

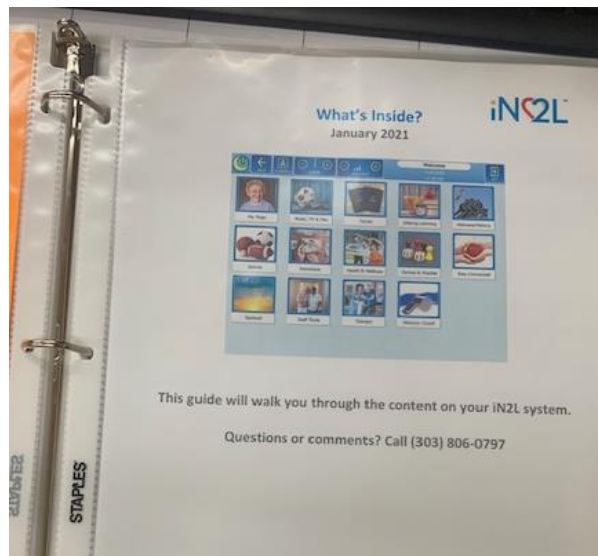
It was reinforced several times that the importance of buy-in, from both staff and residents, is imperative. Starting a new program can be overwhelming, but getting people excited from the get-go will guarantee a high level of future participation. iN2L content that residents and staff are currently excited about and enjoying are the slot machine games, the video chatting and text message feature, For a Good Cause (or often referred to as "the rice game"), and book club and travel content.

"Take the Fear Away"

When Director of Social Services, Liz Cole-Salcido, started to utilize iN2L at Artesia Christian Home Skilled Nursing, she sensed apprehension from staff. Their apprehension was understandable as this was brand-new technology that, for some, came with a learning curve. Liz encouraged staff to not be afraid to use the technology. She empowered staff to take ownership over the program and to be fearless.

Organization is Key

When Activity Program Director, Loren Apodaca, launched the iN2L program at West Anaheim Extended Care, one of the first things she did was create a binder.
